

FORWARD-LOOKING VISION

The Houten Hotel in Almere, the Netherlands, embodies its forward-looking vision in its name. The extension to the existing Festijn Culinair restaurant has 172 hotel rooms on four floors with a main timber supporting structure, using a combination of systems. KLH® - CLT was chosen for the floors, gallery, elevator cores and walls of the construction. The building volume of the restaurant faces the traffic circle and the surrounding sun. The newly built wings are four stories high and accessed from the outside by galleries. The galleries are enclosed by a timber facade frame. This gives the gallery the appearance of a veranda through the double glass doors of the hotel room and also provides the necessary

shading. The staggered facades and roofs make the structure special and provide many unique spaces. Thanks to the KLH® - CLT construction, the building is flexible in its room layout and can now meet its new use as a combination of restaurant and hotel.
